Dear Parents and Carers

It's been a busy and successful start to the year at school and the children have been enjoying a range of trips and visitors. 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LEARNING CHALLENGES	ATTENDANCE
Reception: Who help us? How can we help others? The children will be visited by doctors, nurses, fire officers and many more to discuss how they help us and our community. The children will be regularly visiting Castle Croft Care home to identify ways they can help the elderly people who live there.	Current whole school attendance is 95.8%

Year One: Where can we find different animals around the world? The children will be using maps and atlases to explore the world's continents and oceans to locate different animals from around the world. I'm sure they are looking forward to their visit from Mo (our animal expert) on Tuesday 28th January.

Year Two: How can we celebrate how people have changed the world? The children will be looking back in history to explore the lives of Isambard Kingdom Brunel and Mary Seacole to identify their achievements and the impact they have had on our lives today.

Year Three: How can we teach children from the MAT about the Egyptians? The children began their challenge by learning from an Egyptologist that visited our school. So far, they have studied the geography of Egypt, looking at its location on a world map and climate. They have compared the Egyptians to other civilisations and studied the use of hieroglyphs.

Year Four: How can we make a difference to our planet? Year 4 have been learning about the Roman Empire. They have discovered what it took to be a Roman soldier, the places that they conquered, and have studied key figures, such as, Julius Ceasar.

Year Five: Anglo Saxons and Vikings Year 5 began their challenge with a workshop introducing them to the Saxons and Vikings. They are currently studying Sutton Hoo, looking at the discoveries made there. They have been challenged to find out the type of man that was buried there by looking at historical evidence and artefacts.

Year Six: How can we teach other children from the MAT about evolution? Year 6 have been studying evolution. They have looked at the characteristics of living things, investigating what inherited and environmental characteristics are. They enjoyed their visit to the Lapworth Museum where they learnt about fossils, rocks and dinosaurs.
