



Antarctica

Antarctica is the continent at the South Fole and it is almost entirely covered in ice. It is the fifth largest continent and is surrounded by the Southern Ocean. As the temperature in Antarctica can dip to below -80°C (-112°F), no one lives there all the time. No country owns Antarctica. Scientists from 29 countries visit research stations to carry out experiments throughout the year. Despite the cold, Antarctica is home to animals such as penguins, seals, and seabirds.



Antarctica is the land that surrounds the South Pole. It is the Earth's coldest and driest continent. The mainland has a layer of up to four-kilometre-thick ice, howling winds, and freezing temperatures. Only along the slightly warmer coastline can plants survive and animals come

ashore. Small and hardy, lichens, mosses, and hairgrass are among the few plants able to grow. The surrounding ocean is full of fish and krill, which many sea animals and millions of seabirds, such as skuas, penguins, petrels, and terns, feed on. Many come ashore to breed (have young) or to scavenge (take remains of) food from these breeding sites.

It's all about the verb

You can identify whether a sentence is present or past tense based on the verb.

E.g.

I am walking

I walked

In each example, the root word 'walk' exists.

In the first example, it is written in the present tense i.e. It is happening now.

In the second example, it is written in the past tense. i.e. it has already happened.



Verb Endings: -ed



When something happened in the past, a verb should be in the past tense. For many words, adding the ending –ed to the verb makes it past tense. Example: talk — talked
