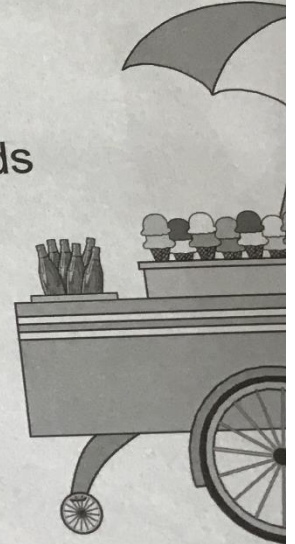
## The Ice-cream Man
