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

Maths 6/7/2020

This week the children will be learning about length and height and have an opportunity to practise using some of the language involved.

Guidance

Children begin by using language to describe length and height, e.g. the tree is tall, the pencil is short. When making direct comparisons, they may initially say something is big or bigger than something else. Encourage them to use more specific mathematical vocabulary relating to length (longer, shorter), height (taller, shorter), and breadth (wider, narrower)

They move onto make indirect comparisons using identical objects such as blocks or cubes to measure each item, e.g. The sand tray is 5 bricks long. The table is 4 is blocks long. The sand tray is longer than the table. They may also compare distances to see which is further or nearer.



Ask them to compare heights with their siblings or yourself.

- Can they find something in the house that is taller than them?
- Shorter than them?
- About the same size as them?
- Can they measure their heights using blocks?

Ask a friend or sibling if you can measure how tall they are. Ask them to lie on the floor and measure them using objects. What do you think would work best? You could try DVDs or shoes of the same size. Ensure that whatever you use to measure them with, are the same size. Practise using the language shortest, shorter, short, tallest, taller and tall.
