Watch the tutorial on halving on Class Dojo. Find objects around your home that your child could use to aid their counting. After watching the video, ask your child to use the same method to find halves of totals under 10. Remind them of the importance that halving means sharing a total by 2 and that they must share equally in order to find the correct answer.

Fine motor activity:

Handwriting Warm-Up Fine Motor Exercises
Make sure you are sitting comfortably and upright.
Place your fingertips together, as if they are doing "push ups" against each other.
Repeat a number of times.

Ask your child to write a word or a sentence about what they did over the weekend. Remind them of writing on the line and keeping their letters the same size.

Thematic 22/6/2020

This week your child will start to design their own magical creature! They will work towards a final project where they can choose to draw, paint or build their creature and present it to their class using Class Dojo. Today, we would like them to think about what their magical creature's special powers will be. Here are a few examples of magical powers that your child can choose from or they can think of their own ideas.

- Breathe under water or breathe fire.
- Being able to fly.
- Becoming invisible.

Maths 23/6/2020

This activity could be completed with toys, sweets or something your child would be quick to point out hasn't been shared fairly! Get two plates/boxes or baskets and a group of toys, sweets, biscuits etc and purposefully share them unfairly. Ask your child if you have shared the objects out equally; when they point out your mistake ask them to explain what you have done wrong. Allow your child to correct your mistake and address any misconceptions that they may have. Encourage them to use language such as "share", "half", "fair", "same" "equal". The treat at the end could be that they get to eat or play with whatever they have been using.

Extra challenge- Challenge your child with the question "can you halve all numbers fairly?"

Fine motor activity:


Maths 24/6/2020



Maths 25/6/2020



Ask your child to draw two circles in their activity book or on a piece of paper. Show them how we can halve a total by drawing dots in each circle. Look back at the video posted on Monday to help them children remember this method. Can they use this method to halve numbers up to 10? If your child is able to do this independently, ask them to halve numbers above 10.

Extra challenge- Can your child write the number sentence to match the question they have answered practically, e.g. $8 \div 2 =$

Handwriting 25/6/2020

Press hands and fingers together with palms flat, squeeze then stretch fingers out wide. Repeat 5 times.



Ask your child to write the following word using their best handwriting – tail. Remind them to try and write on the line and to make their letters the same size. Can your child say or write a sentence using this word?

PSHE 25/6/2020

Goals and Aspirations

Talk to your child about what they want to achieve in Year 1. Do they want to get better at reading writing or maths? What would they like to learn about? How will they make sure they achieve these goals? They could draw or write about their ideas in the thought bubble and share with their teacher.

Talk to your child about what they want to be when they grow up. Why do they want to do that? How will they achieve this? When they were your age, Mr Carr wanted to be a car designer and Miss Howes wanted to be a bus driver.

Fine motor activity:



Ask your child to write the following word using their best handwriting – snail. Remind them to try and write on the line and to make their letters the same size. Can your child say or write a sentence using this word?

Thematic 26/6/2020

Today we would like your child to think about what their magical creature is going to look like. Remind them that their magical creature may need certain features due to the magical creatures they chose on Monday, for example their creature would need wings in order to fly or may need a tail to swim under water. Ask your child to write down what their creature will look like or draw a picture of it to remind themselves what they will need to draw, paint or build during their final project.
