



Think back to yesterday's work. What are the key features of an informal letter? Who would we write an informal letter to? Why would we write an informal letter?

When writing an informal letter, different sentence types are used. The main sentence types used within an informal letter are:

Statements - Statements are sentences which tell you something. They always begin with a capital letter end with a full stop.

Questions - Questions are sentences that ask you something. They should begin with a capital letter and end with a question mark.

Exclamations - Exclamations are sentences that begin with 'what' or 'how'. They are full sentences, include a verb and end with an exclamation mark.

Look back at the model texts can you find any examples of these sentence types?
