




Main activity:

For this activity you will need a group of objects to share e.g. pasta, biscuits, toys etc


With an adult discuss the following questions whilst solving the task.

Children share objects equally into groups. They can use concrete objects to support this, such as counters to represent the biscuits/triangles. They can represent the sharing using simple pictures.

How many are there in total? How many groups are we making? How can we share them? Why is it important for the groups to be equal? How many are in each group? What does the symbol + mean? How many triangles are there in total? How many groups are there? How can we share them equally?

Could we put one in each group and see how many are left over? Are there enough left for another one in each group? How many are in each group now?

Are all the groups equal?
